*Organised by ICLEI, Basque Country, Bizkaia County, City of Bilbao and Udalsarea 21

*Partners: CoR, OECD, Eurocities, Energy Cities, ACR+, and others

THE BASQUE DECLARATION AND THE GLOBAL SUSTAINABLE FRAMEWORKS



On September 25th 2015, countries adopted a set of 17 goals to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure prosperity for all as part of a new sustainable development agenda. These are the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In December 2015, at the Paris climate conference (COP21), 195 countries adopted the first-ever universal, legally binding global climate deal. The aim is to avoid dangerous climate change by limiting global warming to well below 2°C.

- 10 overarching **objectives**
- support to national governments and EU in reaching their goals
- support and accelerate 3 **transformations** to ensure quality of life within the limits of our earth





a) Socio-cultural transformation

Provide **equal access** to municipal services and explore new ways of service provision.

Nurture social innovation and entrepreneurship, collaborative and civic economy and other emerging approaches.

Active involvement of citizens, beyond participatory planning into participatory implementation.





b) Socio-economic transformation

Focus on opportunities for local economy, local value chains and local resources.

Encourage development towards **circular economy** and apply new approaches to financing.

Procure products and services with high environmental performance, taking into account the social and economic impacts of purchasing decisions.





c) Technological transformation

Select and apply **demand driven** technological solutions, in the interest of citizens and the public good. Public procurement as instrument to influence the **market**.

Support equal access to information and open data as a standard to be applied by local governments.


















TRANSFORMATIVE ACTIONS


